As such, improving the energy efficiency of these properties is very important to us. We will work with landlords to improve the energy efficiency of their properties, and will endeavour to take on (for private sector leasing / temporary accommodation) only those properties which provide a reasonable degree of thermal comfort. 	
Minimum standards in Council properties	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Haringey's ALMO (Homes for Haringey) is currently working on an Energy Strategy which will set out the aims and ambitions for the stock over the next ten years. 	2012
